Saint David's closes

On Sunday 29 September 2024 Rev Murray Lambert led a public closing service of thanksgiving for the small church, following the January 2023 earthquake damage which rendered it unsafe for public use.

From Sunday 25 October 1925, Saint David's was an absolute hive of activity. Over the years 38 weddings and 220 baptisms were held at St David's; however, there were few funerals.

The annual Christmas event from 1992 onwards drew scores of visitors each year.

From around 1990, services were held bi-monthly; however, in 2011 they were increased to monthly. In May 2021 services increased to weekly. The final service was held on 18 December 2022, just weeks before the earthquake that badly damaged the building. To bring the building to required standards would have cost over \$200,000, and with natural attrition seeing the congregation shrink to a handful and the building no longer fit for purpose, the decision was made to close.

In giving thanks through prayer for all that St David's had meant to the wider community for close to a century—the opportunity to spread the gospel, prayers offered on behalf of others, the love and fellowship, memories made and the work of many in keeping the church operating—Rev Murray sought the Lord's continued blessing on the gospel being proclaimed in Waharoa.

We do thank our sponsors, who make our newsletter possible. Please support them!

And we thank the volunteers who have been serving on our rosters, one on the cleaning roster for 32 years!

Annual Report for Session 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024

In July 2023, we took part in the Church Life survey, then in June 2024, we filled in the survey for our parish Re-View with Kaimai Presbytery. The latter turned out to be more useful because the results were analysed, and helpful guidance provided to us by our facilitator, the very Rev Ray Coster.

Cuppa & Chat has continued to meet once a month on a Friday morning, and have generously invited members of the congregation to join them on at least two occasions when they had interesting speakers coming: once it was the police speaking on keeping ourselves safe, and once it was an expo of the mobility scooters available.

Ann Roberts and Rev Nigel Crocombe celebrated their wedding on 22 July 2023 in Raglan.

The church made a donation to help flood victims in Wairoa after cyclone Gabrielle.

We had one unpleasant incident to deal with when some people arrived after church one Sunday when most of the congregation had departed, asking for monetary assistance. They became aggressive. The police have since helped us work out a policy for dealing safely with such happenings.

A midwinter Christmas lunch was held on 1 July; this was very much enjoyed by the small group of attendees. The entertainment by singers from Waitomo that followed was also much appreciated.

We sent a commissioner to the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand from 27 September to 1 October. Unlike the formal occasions weighted heavily towards business that were the Assemblies of the past, this was a friendly, warm, worshipful occasion, illuminated by flashes of

brilliant humour. The necessary business was still done, but in a respectful way and largely through consensus.

Disappointingly, the combined churches' Light Party was cancelled because of adverse weather.

A Spring Fair cum garage sale on November 18 failed to empty our shed of much that is surplus to our requirements; we will be making another effort and seeing that it is better advertised.

We had a Picnic Service on 11 February at the home of Trevor and Glenys Coley. What a privilege it was to be at their home. Despite small numbers at our Harvest Thanksgiving service, the produce donated was considerable. It was distributed to the Support House and to Beattie Home.

Session would like to express their gratitude to the Board of Managers who have been consistently on the ball with maintaining the buildings and grounds of St David's. Our thanks to our very able treasurer, Claire Sherrington, for the hours and hours of work she has put in. All those who have taken turns cleaning the church, freshening the floral arrangements, and providing morning teas, we thank you sincerely for your work. We do thank Nina Mark for handling hall bookings and organising helpers for the serving of refreshments after funerals. Our single musician, Jane McIlroy, we acknowledge with deep gratitude: thank you for your dedicated contribution to services, funerals, and social occasions.

Our most heart-felt thanks to God our Father who has allowed us the privilege of serving him through Jesus Christ, our Saviour. To him be all glory and praise.
